For the past 60 years, the Jumble Shop has served the Omaha community by offering gently used quality clothing and household goods.

As one of the Junior League's oldest and most successful fundraisers, the revenue generated by the Jumble Shop is used to fund Junior League programs and volunteer activities.

A few fast facts:

- 100% of the profits generated by the Jumble Shop benefit the Junior League of Omaha, its programs and volunteer initiatives.
- 100% of the merchandise sold in the Jumble Shop is donated by league members, public donations, local and national corporations.
- Junior League members dedicate more than 2,000 volunteer hours annually. Volunteer tasks encompass: inventory, personnel management, merchandising, staffing, marketing, fundraising, donation solicitation, community relations, finance and operations.

Serving the Underserved

More than a fundraiser, the Jumble Shop itself meets the needs of the underserved in our city.

Due to the variety of donations received, families are able to purchase school supplies, holiday gifts, baby clothes and other household items.

Several Jumble Shop customers participate in community-funded workforce training and do not have the means to purchase appropriate interview clothing. The Jumble Shop offers several men's and women's suits, shoes and accessories that will help to make a professional first impression.

Every year the Jumble Shop donates several items to assist flood and fire victims, shelter clients, foster children, and nursing home residents.

Partnering with several community-based agencies, the Jumble Shop is a viable resource for people who often times have no other options.
